

Community Farm Worker - Summer Student

Part-Time Contract Position

Commitment: 30 hours/week - flexible shifts with some weekend work

Compensation: \$18/hour

Start Date: May 29, 2023 (11-week placement)

Location: Ubuntu Community Farm; North York, ON and Withrow Park (Farmer's Market)

This position is funded through the Canada Summer Jobs Program, which requires that the applicants:

• Be between 15-30 years of age (inclusive)

- Be Canadian Citizens, permanent residents, or persons on whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act
- Be legally entitled to work according to the relevant provincial legislation and regulations

ABOUT US

The Ubuntu Community Collective (UCC) is an emerging non-profit cooperative organization based in Toronto. We co-create braver spaces and provide access to services curated for intergenerational mothers of the African Diaspora. We support the motherhood journey in order to thrive-mind, body and soul.

The Ubuntu Community Farm (UCF) is our Social Enterprise start-up that we operate out of Downsview Park. It includes a market garden and a community healing garden. We grow vegetables and herbs using ecological practices. We intend to connect our community with the land and contribute to build a thriving local food system.

POSITION OVERVIEW

UCF is building its farm operations and is searching for a motivated and passionate self-identified youth (30 years and under) of African descent to join our team as a Community Farm Worker (summer student). UCF consists of a small team and all employees are an integral part of making the season a success.

The Community Farm Worker will work with the farm team on all aspects of small-scale organic vegetable production, such as seeding, planting, harvesting, weeding, packing, sales, greenhouse management and crop maintenance.

Experience in farming is not necessary but an asset. Farming is a physically demanding job. On-the-job training and education will be provided as required. This position is considered part-time and seasonal, starting May 29, 2023, and ending after 11 weeks with the possibility of extension.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Seedling care including seeding, watering, potting up, fertilizing, hardening-off
- Garden bed preparation such as broadforking, hauling compost and mulch, trellising, securing and removing large tarps, row covers, nets etc.
- Assist with crop care and maintenance
- Harvesting in the field and greenhouse
- Transplanting, weeding, composting
- Irrigation management for field crops
- Wash and pack produce for sale on site, to CSA members, Farmer's Market and wholesale delivery
- Assist with Farm Stand and off-site Farmer's Market set-up, tear-down, sales and customer service
- Assist with data collection and record-keeping on paper and using a digital tool.
- Interact with the public at work as our farm is in a public park, and guide community members accessing the farm.
- Be a positive and proactive contributor to workplace safety
